### Permit Parking

SONA residents in several areas have requested more information about permit parking. Some of the complaints and questions come from over crowded streets due to the combination of apartments and college students. Others are raising the question of where people will park once the light rail station is opened next year. Could Corlista and College become the de facto parking lots for the station? What do you think? SONA will be presenting information at our September 2004 general meeting.

### SONA Earns CAP Grant

SONA has received notification that we are to receive \$9,000.00 in funding from Cycle 18 of the Community Action and Pride Grant Program. This program is funded by the Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services Department of the City of San Jose.

SONA submitted a grant proposal to help cover newsletter costs and to underwrite a National Night Out celebration. Competition this year was heavy due to the budget cuts in services offered to neighborhoods.

The Burbank/Del Monte Neighborhood Advisory Committee will also receive funding for document publication and a celebration to kick off the Richmond/Menker revitalization project.

## City of San Jose Referral Numbers

The City of San Jose has many different departments handling the various services needed by residents and businesses. Listed to the left are some of those numbers.

When in doubt, call the 24-hour a day hotline. If you are not sure what department you need or who you need to talk to, the operator will figure that out, give you the correct number and connect you to that department or person.

The 311 non-emergency number is for reporting low level crimes already committed that don't need immediate police response (auto burglary, vandalism, etc.). Even if you think it's a petty event, it's important for all crimes to be reported. This lets the police know what activities are taking place in the neighborhood. If, for instance, your car is broken into and you aren't going to report it to your insurance company, SJPD needs to know that these crimes are taking place so they can increase patrols in our area. **Helpful Hint:** When you get the first recording, hit the zero button to avoid voice mail. Always get a report number.

The 911 emergency number is for all crimes in progress or emergency medical needs. If you see a crime taking place, do not intervene. If, for instance, you hear fighting in a house behind you, witness drug or alcohol activity or any other crime, call and give the dispatcher as much information as possible.

Report all suspected code violations (cars stored in yards, yards with piles of garbage or junk, housing violations, etc.) to Code Enforcement.

Report any and all graffiti to the hotline and volunteers will respond to the site.

The Recycling and Garbage line can be used to report bins not picked up, order different sized containers or get information on pick up days.

The Fire Department has programs to help make your home safer. The City Arborist can answer questions about your street trees. The City's library and Parks Departments have ongoing programs for everyone. Seniors can get information on housing, food service and other programs at a separate number. Want to know how to get around the city using public transit? The information line can help you plot your course.

Councilman Ken Yeager's office is always available to field questions and comments concerning our district.
